Madhya Pradesh Transfers Dairy Operations to NDDB for Five Years to Boost Milk Production



In a significant move to enhance milk production and increase farmers' incomes, the Madhya Pradesh government has approved the transfer of operations of the Madhya Pradesh State Cooperative Dairy Federation and its affiliated milk unions to the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) for five years. The decision was made in a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Mohan Yadav in Bhopal.

Despite opposition from, which raised concerns over a potential takeover of the state's Sanchi brand by Gujarat's Amul, the state aims to boost its dairy industry. Madhya Pradesh, currently the third-largest milk producer in India, contributes 9-10% of the nation's milk output and exceeds the national average for milk availability at 644 grams per person daily.

The government aims to double milk production over the next five years, with legal amendments to the Cooperative Act under consideration to facilitate this partnership.

Alka Upadhyaya Reviews Progress of Key Animal Husbandry and Dairy Schemes in Eastern States



Smt. Alka Upadhyaya, Secretary AHD, Government of India, chaired a regional review meeting in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, to assess the progress of various animal husbandry and dairy schemes. Officials from Eastern states, including Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, West Bengal, and Meghalaya, participated.

The meeting focused on key schemes like the Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM), National Livestock Mission (NLM), NADCP, and NPDD. Upadhyaya urged officials to address fodder constraints and enhance the productivity of bovines, emphasizing infrastructure optimization for milk processing and collection.

She also highlighted the need to promote indigenous dairy products and entrepreneurship through schemes like the Realigned AHIDF. The importance of the upcoming 21st Livestock Census and disease control programs like NADCP was underscored, along with recognizing states' efforts in breeding farm initiatives under NLM.

Indian Immunologicals and NDDB Launch Indigenous IVF Media for Bovine Embryo Transfer



Indian Immunologicals Ltd. (IIL), in collaboration with the NDDB, has launched 'Shashthi,' an indigenous in-vitro fertilization (IVF) media for bovine embryo transfer. This advancement aims to make IVF technology more affordable for Indian dairy farmers.

IVF technology, through Ovum Pick Up and In vitro Embryo Production (OPU-IVEP), enables the selection of superior bovine embryos, enhancing dairy production. IIL Managing Director K. Anand Kumar highlighted that the new IVF media is 33% cheaper than imported alternatives, reducing the cost per embryo from ₹1,000 to ₹650.

Currently, India transfers 8,000-10,000 embryos annually, resulting in 2,000-2,500 calves. With rising demand and government subsidies, embryo transfers are expected to increase significantly. Data from 22 IVF labs shows that around 30,000 embryos were produced between 2020 and 2023, leading to 3,000 calf births.

Punjab Minister Gurmeet Singh Khuddian Inaugurates Pashu Palan Mela at Vet University, Ludhiana

Punjab's Cabinet Minister for Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, and Food Processing, S. Gurmeet Singh Khuddian, inaugurated the Pashu Palan Mela at Guru Angad Dev Veterinary & Animal Sciences University (GADVASU), Ludhiana. He encouraged farmers to explore livestock entrepreneurship, highlighting dairy farming's potential for daily earnings.



The event, themed "Uttpadan ton Utpad Banaiye, Aao Vadh Munafa Paiye," promoted value addition in livestock products as a pathway to boosting farmer income. Vice-Chancellor Dr. Jatinder Paul Singh Gill emphasized that value-added products offer higher returns compared to traditional livestock farming.

The Mela showcased university research, education, and extension programs, attracting farmers, scientists, and industry representatives. The College of Fisheries and Department of Animal Nutrition launched a mineral mixture for fish, while various departments demonstrated advanced farming techniques and sold products like milk testing kits and mastitis diagnosis tools.

The two-day event featured stalls from veterinary pharmaceuticals, livestock equipment suppliers, and self-help groups, offering value-added products and training materials. Thousands of farmers from Punjab and neighboring states attended, exploring new opportunities in livestock farming and fisheries.

Arunachal Pradesh Seeks Central Support for Veterinary College and Livestock Development



Arunachal Pradesh's Animal Husbandry & Dairy Development Minister, Gabriel D. Wangsu, urged the Central Government for assistance in establishing a veterinary college and integrating mithun and yak into entrepreneurship programs under the National Livestock Mission. His requests were made during the Monsoon Meet chaired by Union Animal Husbandry Minister Dr. Rajeev Ranjan Singh.

Wangsu highlighted the state's need for more resources to improve animal husbandry, requesting funds under the ESVHD-MVU scheme for 100 mobile veterinary units and additional manpower for the 21st livestock census, including 100 enumerators and 50 supervisors.

He also sought the introduction of high-yield genetically modified fodder grass, developed by the Indian Grassland and Fodder Research Institute, to enhance fodder production. Addressing regional concerns, Wangsu called for a dedicated piggery development scheme to combat African swine flu and support the import of high-quality pigs.

Union Minister Singh responded positively, pledging to address these issues and promising a visit to Arunachal Pradesh to further discuss the development of the state's livestock sector.

Jharkhand CM Launches 236 Mobile Veterinary Units to Enhance Animal Healthcare

Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren launched 236 mobile veterinary units (MVUs) on Tuesday, aimed at providing doorstep animal healthcare services for livestock farmers. These modern ambulances, equipped with veterinarians, paramedics, and primary medical facilities, will offer diagnostic tests and treatment, an official stated.



The CM also introduced a toll-free number, 1962, for an integrated call center in Ranchi to provide healthcare guidance and ambulance services. Soren emphasized the government's commitment to improving agriculture and allied sectors over the last four and a half years. He highlighted policies including a loan waiver of up to ₹2 lakh for farmers and the introduction of insurance coverage for livestock.

State Agriculture Secretary Abu Bakr Siddique announced that the ambulance service will be available in 236 blocks across all 24 districts. Farmers can contact the call center to request assistance, with experts providing remote guidance or dispatching an ambulance if needed. State Animal Husbandry Director Kiran Kumari Pasi added that ambulances will be deployed for serious cases requiring on-site treatment.

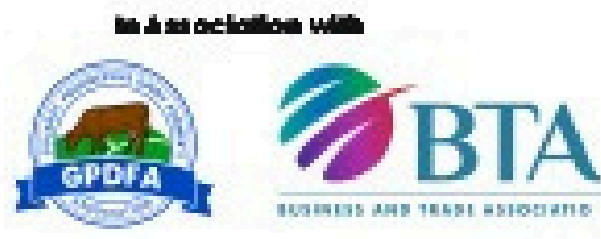
Odisha CM Unveils ₹1,423 Crore Mukhyamantri Kamadhenu Yojana to Boost Milk Production



Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced the launch of the Mukhyamantri Kamadhenu Yojana on Friday, with an outlay of ₹1,423.47 crore aimed at boosting milk production in Odisha. Speaking at the inaugural session of the 'Monsoon Meet 2024' for the animal husbandry and dairy sector.

Majhi outlined the program's focus on establishing small dairy units, subsidizing calf feed, expanding livestock insurance coverage, and strengthening dairy cooperatives over the next five years. The CM highlighted a new MoU with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) to bolster the state's milk cooperatives and enhance production. He also announced plans to collaborate with NDDB on a vaccine production unit in Berhampur and a state-of-the-art feed analytical laboratory in Bhubaneswar.

Majhi introduced the Mukhyamantri Prani Kalyan Yojana, aimed at promoting a compassionate approach towards stray animals, and discussed amending the Orissa Prevention of Cow Slaughter Act, 1960, to reduce animal cruelty. The Monsoon Meet marked a collaborative effort to strengthen India's livestock and dairy sectors.

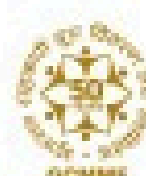

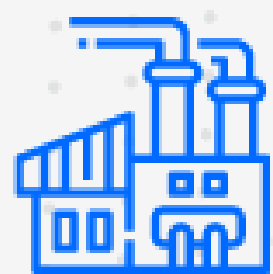

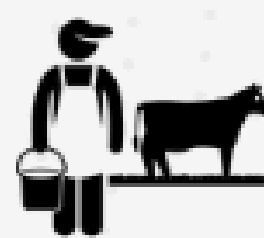
